President Report

- Motion to formally change name from "Benicia Youth Soccer" to "Benicia Arsenal Futbol Club" on all official documents (and pay the fee associated with the name change, reimbursing David Balter). Approved unanimously.
- David will investigate need for a fictitious name for the corporation.
- Motion to appoint Derek Weldon to Acting VP. Approved unanimously
- Sponsorship document to be resent. Minor modifications done, approved unanimously
- Still need help finishing certain pages of the website.
- Jeff Kuta: club could make a donation in the name of Joe Connell. Motion to make a \$100 donation to the charity chosen by his family (Bridgeport Fish Enhancement Foundation). Approved unanimously.

Referee Coordinator

• Jeff Kuta, in lieu of Reba Halverson, introduced the concept of sideline manager. The role is to model good behavior and help channel parents emotions in a more positive way. Training can be provided. Sideline manager can help diffuse situations. Scott suggested emphasizing the need of having more licensed referees (parents) in order to help with this issue. Jose mentioned the fact that these types of problems had been decreasing over time. Scott suggests to continue this discussion at next board meeting.

Vice President Report

Select Coordinator Report

- Tryouts went very well (some problems with field lights on first night). Venue was great. Spirit wear did ~\$300-400. Rodrigo suggested to have talk with kids ahead of time in order to make new kids feel more welcome
- Tournament planning under way. Little competition from other tournaments as of now.
- San Jose Earthquakes offers development academy at no cost (for players and coaches)
- Reached out to Nike, but size of club won't qualify for Nike's interest.

DOC Report

- Need link for kids to register and make first payment. Suggestion: first payment by 1st of June.
